In Memoriam Dr. Alfred E. "AL" Decoteau (1929-2015)

It is with great sadness that I report to you that a great friend and mentor of mine. Dr. Al Decoteau, passed away in the early morning hours of September 10, 2015. Dr. Al was an amazing man that took the time to educate so many without hesitation. He was a Avicultural wonder in many ways, from keeping and breeding birds to leading national societies to promote education in the field of bird keeping. Services were held at the New Hampshire Crematory Association in Manchester, New Hampshire. A remembrance service was held at the Brookline Chapel, Brookline, NH.

He was married to Helen Decoteau who passed away many years ago after 32 years of marriage. They had three sons, Kevin, Jay and Daren and many Grandchildren and great Grandchildren. Al attended North Dakota University and The College of Veterinary Sciences at Iowa State, where he graduated in 1962. After graduating Al spent a year as a Vet In Minnesota before joining the USDA disease eradication division. He later moved on to APHIS where he served on the Mexican border and later became Chief Vet for the north central region based in Columbus Ohio. He was promoted to APHIS director for Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands before being appointed director of the New England Region in 1972. This is when I first met Al. He was the person responsible for my federal pet shop license. I was immediately struck by his helpfulness to a young man just starting out in carrying some exotic animals. In the next few years we became great friends and shared each others interest in Aviculture.

To say that Al Decoteau had an impact on Aviculture is akin to saying the computer has had an impact on our society. For one man to have had so many accomplishments and so many contributions to bird keeping, it's unheard of in one lifetime. I was lucky enough to have known Al and been involved in many events with him. Al started the New Hampshire Aviculture Society in the mid 70's. Back then there were few local judges. Al invited me to judge his NHAS show. I discussed with him the possibility of setting up chairs so that I could explain the judging process to the exhibitors, he agreed (at that time most judging was private). From then on we both demanded galleries for our judgings, which later became normal at all bird shows.

He later was one of the first members of a fledgling Northeast Finch Society. He was NFSS's first, 1st Vice President, later becoming 4th Vice President in charge of the Judge's Panel. A position he enjoyed much more. I will go out on a limb and say, no one has judged more bird shows in the United States than Al Decoteau, by a long shot. He was an accredited judge for the National Finch and Softbill Society, the African Lovebird Society, The National Cockatiel Society and the

Society of Parrot Breeders and Exhibitors. Al's judging was wonderful. He spent as much time as required to be sure everyone enjoyed and understood the judging. He was always ready to answer any questions with a smile on his face and a twinkle in his eyes, and in an engaging way that was owned by Al Decoteau.

Dr. Al is not only known for his involvement in NFSS, he was also an accomplished author of several books, including the Handbook of Amazon Parrots, the Handbook of Cockatoos, the Handbook of Macaws, and the great book Exhibiting Birds, along with others and many Avicultural articles. He was the founder and long time leader of the Society of Parrot Breeders and Exhibitors. Along with



myself and Harvey Smith, Al was also a director of the original National Kaytee Great American Bird Show. In 2014 Al was awarded the AFA Gold Avy Award for his lifetime achievements. Many don't know it, but Al was also a champion dog breeder, winning more than 10 championships with his English Bulldogs and Australian Terriers. Al had a wide variety of interests including precious stones.

To me personally, I have lost a friend of over 40 years. Al helped me in so many ways over the years. He was a forming member of the National Finch and Softbill Society as well as a respected judge and panel director. He was the founder of the Society of Parrot Breeders and Exhibitors and it's leader for many years. To say that he will be missed by so many, is an understatement. To his sons Daren, Kevin, and Jay, and his three surviving brothers, Edmond, John and Mitch and his entire family members and friends, I offer my profound condolences on behalf of a Avicultural community that will miss him dearly.

To AI I say, know that you were loved, know that you are loved, know that you will not be soon forgotten.

Upon the urging of Ashley, one of his grandchildren and with the approval of his family, Facebook will keep his Facebook page online. It has been renamed "Remembering Al Decoteau." You may choose to leave remembrances there.

The Garden Aviary

From my perspective, horticulture and aviculture have always been linked together. I grow beautiful plants and flowers because seeing them makes me happy, but I also appreciate seeing how much joy and excitement they bring to my birds. As aviculturists, we must strive to give our birds the best environment that we can provide for them. Providing a cage with food and water is simply not enough. I want to see these birds exploring, bathing, singing, and enjoying the environment I have provided for them. I do this by housing my birds in a garden aviary.

A garden aviary should be sited where you and the birds will get the most enjoyment from it. The structure itself will consist of two parts: The flight and the shelter. The flight should be as large as you can allow, in an area that receives generous sunlight. The flight should only have a wire top to allow sunlight and rain to go through. Constructing it with black wire provides the best unobstructed view.

The shelter is the place where your birds can go to get out of bad weather, and is the only place the birds should be fed. . A bird must always be in a position where it can get out of the rain and sun. Rain, however, is not bad weather; when temperatures are mild, rain plays a crucial part of a bird's overall health. Most rain is acidic, and birds benefit from



it because it helps to soften the keratin sheath on their beaks and nails. Birds will hold their heads in a position that allows rainwater to drip downwards to soften and help reshape their beaks. Rainwater also cleans feathers and stimulates preening. The healthiest and most beautiful feathers are those on a bird exposed to rainwater and direct sunlight.

Sunlight stimulates hormone production, which is very important to molting. Sunlight also plays an important psychological role in a bird's health.

I always have a pond in my garden aviaries. A pond stocked with beautiful goldfish and pond plants will bring even more joy to you and your birds. A good pond liner should be made of Ethylene Propylene Diene Monomer (EPDM), and a concrete layer on top provides traction for the birds.

The pond should be stocked with water lilies, marginal plants, and submerged plants. I also add logs and branches, and a few goldfish (they eat mosquito larvae, algae and yes, even bird poo). Allow the pond, plants, and fish to become



established, creating their own eco system, and it will only need to be cleaned every couple of years.

I plant my aviaries with many kinds of flowering and fruiting trees, shrubs, flowering annuals, and herbs. The trees and shrubs will provide shade from the sunlight. Place some perches in natural full sun to benefit the health of your birds.

For the aviary purchase only plants that have not been recently treated with pesticides. If they have, you may need to wait several months before adding your birds. Arrange the plants in your aviary in the same manner you would do any landscape - trees in the background, along with taller shrubs. Incorporate small boulders, logs, flowers, and untreated mulch. Your plants will also need to be fertilized. I recommend organic only, and even then, keep it under the mulch.

The following is a list of plants I have used in my aviaries. Your local plant nursery can tell you which ones are hardy in your area. I would also like to recommend a partial list of birds I have kept in garden aviaries. Hook bills can be destructive in all but the largest of garden aviaries. I have been successful with the following finches and soft bills.

A well-planned aviary supports happy and healthy birds. My hope in sharing this information is that the reader will be stimulated to consider the possibility of housing their birds, at least a portion of the year, in a garden aviary. The best part of my day is when I step out onto my porch with my coffee to receive the harmonious of singing, tweeting, and chirping from the happy, healthy birds in my beautiful garden aviary.
