



Preparing Chitted Seeds for Your Finches

Lauren Ogburn

Chitted Seed, The Sunbay Way!

Chitted, or sprouted seeds are more nutrient-dense than dry seed, as they are higher in vegetable proteins, vitamins, minerals, enzymes, and chlorophyll. Not just for breeding or young birds, the advantages are year-round, and should be a part of the daily diet.

There are MANY ways to serve your birds chitted seed. None are "wrong". Sharing the way it's done here.

- 1. put a scoop of seed to chit in a strainer, rinse, and let sit in water overnight.
- 2. Rinse and hang the seed in step 1 the next day, leave 24 hours.
- 3. The seed that has been hanging 24 hours should be *just* burst open. If left too long it will grow tendrils, still good, but not as nutritious as just burst open. Rinse well, drain. Feed and watch them devour!

We use "Terri's Sprout Mix" from glamgouldians.com. You can use a good finch mix, (no colored bits) to mix in to stretch it out.

You can purchase the large strainers at World Market, or Amazon. NOTE: some do, but I do not add anything to soak water. Just clean, fresh water.

Update on the Red Siskin

We are thrilled to share the most recent news about the Red Siskin Initiative (RSI) during this special time of year. 2019 has been a year of major achievements for the RSI. We have preserved more than 600 acres of tropical dry forest in northern Venezuela, Red Siskin habitat, thanks to the implementation of agroforestry practices (for coffee and bananas in particular), the farmersí certification as US Organic & Smithsonian Bird Friendly, and hand-in-hand collaboration with local communities, all financed by the US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) and other partners. In July, USFWS, the Smithsonian Institution and American Bird Conservancy gave us the green light for Phase II of

this work, which will expand shade farming even more, start recovering deforested areas, and initiate educational activities for children in the community. The vote of confidence by a major funder to expand our work has been incredibly motivating for us and the farmers partnering with us.

This year we also finished construction on the first Red Siskin Conservation Center (RSCC) in Venezuela, located in a small private zoo, Leslie Pantin Zoo, which is expanding its already large commitment to native wildlife conservation to now include the Red Siskin. RSCC is exclusively for breeding Red Siskins for eventual reintroduction in nature, and will lead education and threat intervention activities as well. And it looks like we finished just in time: Just a few weeks after finishing, we rescued our first set of birds confiscated by wildlife authorities!

To promote a more sustainable use of this bird, we have been collaborating with private breeders, and exchanging ideas and points of view about how to most effectively reduce demand for wild birds, which is a central threat. Together we are exploring best avicultural practices, and listening to ideas about sustainable captive production, culminating in a groundbreaking first meeting with national aviculturists in November.

Given these achievements, our priorities for 2020 include:

- •Expanding collaboration with aviculturists to build and implement a new program, "From extraction to protection.î
- Start breeding Red Siskins in RSCC facilities.
- Start planning and design of pre-release conditioning facilities, to prepare for future reintroductions.
- Fund and build a native plant nursery at the RSCC so that rescued and captive bred Red Siskins can prepare for life in the wild by learning to eat wild food sources.

Despite the continuing difficult situation in Venezuela, 2019 has been an amazing year for the Red Siskin, and this has been partly thanks to your contribution to the RSI in past years. We so appreciate your valuable support and so wanted to keep you updated about our progress.

Your financial support has made a huge difference, especially as Venezuela continues to be a place where a little bit goes a long way. The Red Siskin can still use your help though, so any support you can contribute in 2020 will be equally appreciated. To donate, go to www.redsiskin.org/donations/)
